The Windows of Our Past

In 1958, as a nervous boy of 5 years old, I was walked to school by my Mother. The school was St Helens K1-6. I spent the next 6 years walking the same 5 blocks and attending school. I still have memories of my time there. I remember falling through the ice on the big puddle in the field and having to go home to change. I remember the nurse giving us needles (yes there was a nurse at the school). I remember getting my tongue stuck on the railing of the back steps in the winter and Mrs. Bobber, my grade 3 teacher, coming out and pouring hot water on it. If you misbehaved, you had to stay after school and write lines on the blackboard. I remember Mr. Tessier. my Grade 5 teacher, was a good shot with a chalk eraser and how loud his pointer was on my desk when I was daydreaming. Miss Gillis was my grade 6 teacher and also the Principal. Two of my siblings also went to St Helens.





For the past 15 years or so I have been returning to the same building and visiting with other seniors. There have been many changes and renovations but the soul of the building still remains for me. It is now called SEESA and is like a second home to me. I am so glad they were able to repurpose the provide building to opportunity for seniors attend so many activities. My grade 3 classroom is now the workshop where I attend the Soapstone Carving Club on Wednesday afternoon. I also take Art Classes in the room which used to be the Grade 6 classroom. The old school is now a centre for senior activity

School-days can be happy days, even for a senior citizen.

The classrooms of the old St. Helen's School that once resounded to children's shrieks and laughter are now occupied by a less rambunctious crowd. But laughter is still to be heard in the daily activities there.

Approximately 360 senior citizens are members of the South East Edmonton Seniors' Association now using the school. Membership, at \$3 a year, is rapidly

growing.

The empty shell of a school has been furnished with pool tables and furniture. This was done through grants, donations and money raised through bazaars and flea markets organized by the members.

The 15 seniors on the board of directors are working to establish a centre which will attract seniors from all over the city. The No. 63 bus, which passes by the school, makes access to the centre very easy for those who don't drive.

Bridge, whist, shuffleboard, carpet bowling, crafts classes and drawing and painting are some of the activities integrated into the programs.

Travel films and slides, dances and talks by experts on aspects affecting the daily lives of seniors are gaining in popularity.

The carpentry shop, with its tools worth \$3,500, is being used to build extra cupboards and shelving needed in the art class and coffee room. The construction

of a ramp for seniors in wheelchairs is to begin as soon as the blueprints have been obtained.

"The only cost for the ramp will be the material," said Mary Karpyshyn who is in charge of pub-

licity for the association.

So far there has been a very good response to the members' needs by firms who either made gifts or offered special rates to them. A refrigerator and stove, both donated by a department store, will be used when the plan for hot meals at noon gets under

"But we need more volunteer help," said Tillie Poulsen, who was

elected president of the association in January.

"Right now we need a leader for our choral group meetings on Mondays and volunteers to help with our hand-crafts and other programs."

A special Easter party will be held April 15 and an exhibition of the work done in the drawing and painting class is being planned for later that month.

The centre is open Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7.30 p.m. to 10 p.m. every Wednesday night. Those who have reached 55 are eligible for membership.






