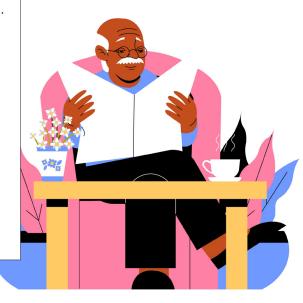

- Current Associate members can renew associate membership for \$40.

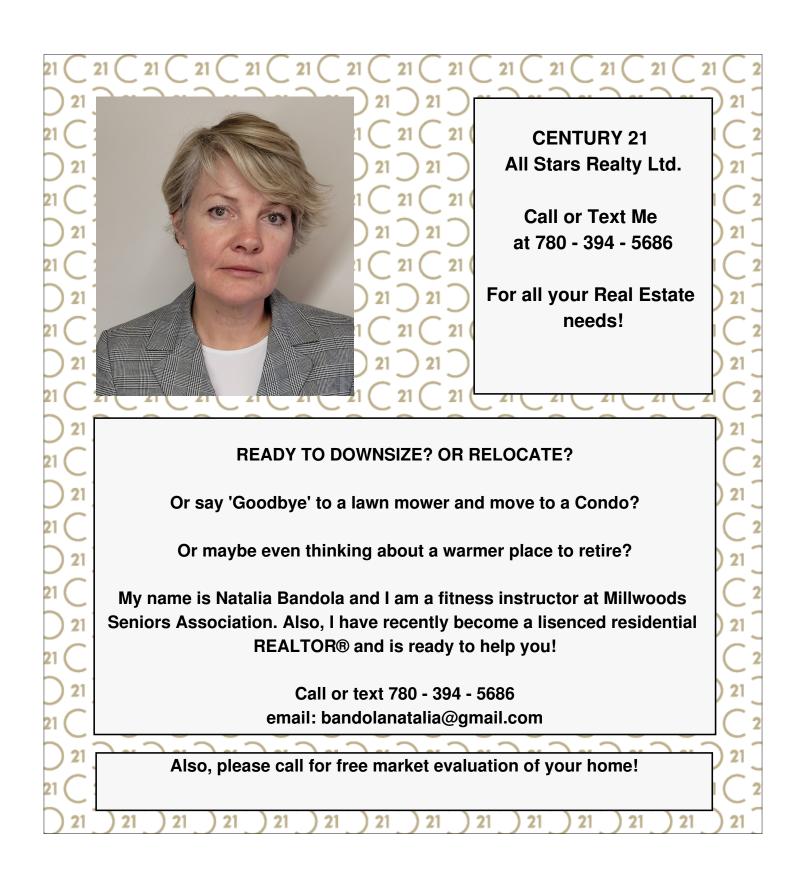
Effective January 1, 2024 Annual membership fees will be:

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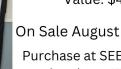

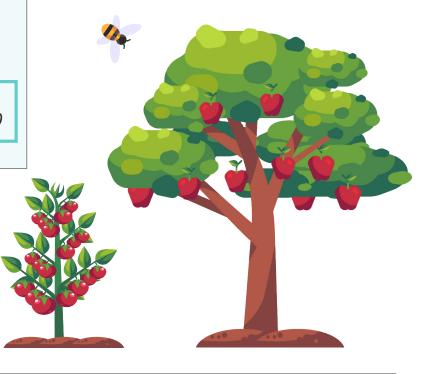

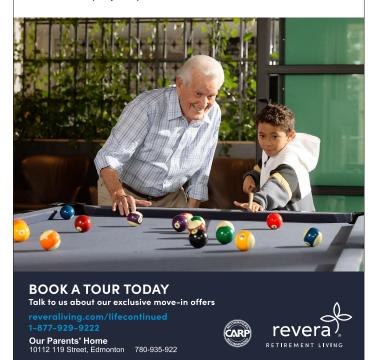
